

One of the reasons that Mark Morris creates dance is to oblige people to experience music. A devotee of the baroque, particularly Bach, Morris has used the work of composers ranging from Virgil Thomson, Giuseppe Verdi and Lou Harrison, to The Violent Femmes and Bob Wills and His Texas Playboys. Although indebted to music, Morris creates choreography that stands solidly on its own. Mikhail Baryshnikov requested that the inaugural programme of his White Oak Project consist entirely of pieces by Morris, a compliment of the greatest distinction. Mark Morris has been described as having "exceptional musicality, originality, craftsmanship, wit, a sense of theatre and most important of all, that mysterious ingredient only found in great art that gives you the shivers because it has touched the soul."
