

Since its inception in 1926, the Martha Graham Dance Company has been a landmark in American culture. The late dancer and choreographer, Martha Graham is recognized as a primal artistic force of the 20th century alongside Picasso, Stravinsky, James Joyce and Frank Lloyd Wright. In 1998, *Time* magazine named Graham "Dancer of the Century." Called "one of the seven wonders of the artistic universe" by *The Washington Post*, the Martha Graham Dance Company perpetuates Graham's legacy through a movement language that exhumes the depths of human emotions.


