A choreographer with a vast movement range and unrivaled musicality, Mark Morris returns to BAM with his dance group and the MMDG Music Ensemble in a richly textured program featuring a New York premiere and three long-anticipated revivals.

Set to a suite of Stephen Foster songs, 1995's *Somebody's Coming to See Me Tonight* both echoes and comments upon the pure, sweetly optimistic Americana of Foster's music. One of the work's lovely interludes centers on three amorous couples—one of them a pair of smitten men, and inflects the Victorian-era lyrics with a resounding modernity. Richard Cumming's beautifully modulated suite of five pieces for solo piano inspired the eponymous *Silhouettes* (1999), a duet that captures the delicate emotional push and pull evoked in the music. Performed before Howard Hodgkin's striking red-and-green backdrop, 1997's *Rhymes with Silver* launches the full company into movement as varied as Lou Harrison's sumptuous commissioned score. Swooping arms, trance-like whirling, a delirious foxtrot, and seemingly incidental gestures that telegraph for miles all come together in a dance that captures Harrison's pan-cultural mix. As in all of Morris's dances—including his newest work, *Rock of Ages*, set to a Schubert piano trio—it's the essential correspondence with the music that propels the dancing.
