**AARON LOUX** grew up in Seattle, WA and began dancing at the Creative Dance Center as a member of Kaleidoscope, a youth modern dance company. He attended the Northwest School from 6th through 12th grade, and during this time he had many wonderful experiences with STG, performing in DANCE This with Kaleidoscope in 1999, with the DANCE This Company from 2001-2005, and with Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater in "Memoria" in 2003. He began his classical training at the Cornish College Preparatory Dance Program and received his B.F.A. from The Juilliard School in 2009. He danced at The Metropolitan Opera and with Arc Dance Company before joining Mark Morris Dance Group in 2010. Aaron is thrilled to have the opportunity to dance in his hometown again.

**SAM SHRIEVE** is a singer/songwriter from Seattle, and currently a Senior at Berklee School of Music in Boston. His first full-length album, released in May of 2009, features contributions from guitar legend Bill Frisell on a beautiful remake of Leonard Cohen's "Hallelujah," and an original jazz-flavored composition, "I'll Be There." Sam's diversity and dynamics in song and lyric writing are evident on this compelling new album. Sam performed in More Music @ The Moore in 2007 and 2011.

**MENTOR, MICHAEL SHRIEVE** was Music Director for MM@M during the first four years of the program. This legendary drummer has written, produced and played on albums that have sold millions of copies worldwide, and was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1998. As the original drummer for Santana, Michael, at age nineteen, was the youngest performer at Woodstock. He helped create the first eight albums of this seminal group and was on the forefront of shaping a new musical era. Michael's recording credits include the masters of popular and avant-garde music: The Rolling Stones, George Harrison, Pete Townsend, Steve Winwood, film composer Mark Isham, and such musical luminaries as John McLaughlin, Jaco Pastorius, Bill Frisell, Zakir Hussain, and Aron Tobin. Michael has also composed music for films, television movies and shows. In 2005 he received the Guitar Center's first annual "Lifetime Achievement Award." He currently plays in his own band Tangletown and is the father of Sam Shrieve.

## EDUCATION & COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

Investing in meaningful experiences for our community  
and future generations of performing artists

Seattle Theatre Group Education and Community Programs extend beyond The Paramount and Moore Theatre stages and into the lives of the greater Seattle community. Each season, STG offers over 50 education programs impacting over 20,000 students and community members from diverse ages and backgrounds.

### THESE PROGRAMS:

**Deepen** significance to performances through opportunities to engage with artists

**Inspire** youth and local artists through training and performance opportunities

**Provide** exposure to the arts through access initiatives



**DANCE This** is a young artist training and performance program in cross cultural and contemporary dance. Each year DANCE This brings together more than 200 young artists (ages 13-22) from diverse communities and backgrounds for intensive dance training, collaboration and performances that share diverse cultures through the art of dance.

**DANCE This** is a multi-faceted program that includes four individual components:

- **The DANCE This Summer Training Intensive**  
(two weeks, June 20th to July 1st, Seattle-based)
- **The DANCE This Youth Matinee and Public Performance**  
(July 8th to 9th, The Moore Theatre)
- **The DANCE This CAMP**  
(one week, August 7th to 13th, state-wide at Centrum, Port Townsend, WA)
- **Global Dance Party**  
(school group matinee and public performance, November 2011)
- **Mark Morris Dance Group Seattle Intensive**  
(June 27th to July 2nd)

In addition to the summer programs, STG provides year round opportunities to participate in master classes and attend dance performances at The Paramount & Moore Theatres.

Nationally renowned professional guest artists work with local youth and are significant to the program's success and impact. Artists from past years include: Savion Glover, legendary tapper; Joffrey Ballet from Chicago; Abdel Salaam from Forces of Nature in New York; Jamel Gaines from Creative Outlet Dance Theatre of Brooklyn; Bahiyah Sayyed Gaines formerly of Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater; Napoleon & Tabitha D'umo from Los Angeles/So You Think You Can Dance; and Seattle-based choreographers Donald Byrd, Sonia Dawkins, Pat Graney and Amy O'Neal.

**MORE MUSIC @ THE MOORE** is a training and performance program for selected young artists representing diverse music genres. The program provides young artists training and rehearsal time with professional musicians; production and promotional support; and the opportunity to perform live in concert at a professional venue, The Moore Theatre. Artists are selected through auditions and recommendations from the music field.

Mentors for the program have included: Music Director, Haitian-American violinist, conductor and composer Daniel Bernard Roumain (DBR); Ernestine Anderson, jazz singer; Dr. Carlene J. Brown, Seattle Pacific University music professor; Dave Dederer, formerly of The Presidents of the United States of America; Sue Ennis, songwriter for Heart; R&B singer Bernadette Bascom; Jill Wangsgard, Bush School music teacher; local rock band School Yard Heroes; Jovino Santos Neto, professor/composer/musician; Michael Shrieve, original drummer for Santana; and Alan White, drummer for Yes.

**YOUNG SONGWRITER'S LAB** provides an opportunity for young musicians (ages 14-21) to dive deep into the songwriting process. Under the mentorship of professional musicians, students learn creative approaches to song composition and lyric writing, along with strategies for navigating the music business. Participants have the opportunity to develop individual and group songwriting skills, gain experience in giving and receiving constructive feedback, receive tickets to selected STG music shows in order to expand songwriting perspectives, and to present their music at an informal showing for friends and family. All styles of music are welcome.

**THE YOUNG CHOREOGRAPHER'S LAB** is for teens interested in pursuing their artistic vision as choreographers as well as dancers. The lab component is designed for young artists to investigate themselves as artists, learning choreography tools and concepts through short movement studies. In the fall, up to 20 young artists meet once a week, for eight weeks of choreography workshops and in the spring selected choreographers create a larger work—all under the mentorship of leading Seattle choreographers. In 2009-2010 two Young Choreographer works were selected to be performed in STG's DANCE This and Global Dance Party at The Paramount and Moore Theatres.

**DANCE FOR PARKINSON'S** is a partnership program with the Booth Gardner Parkinson's Care Center at Evergreen Hospital Medical Center and Spectrum Dance Company to offer dance classes for individuals with Parkinson's Disease and their caregivers. These classes are based on Dance for PDsm, a program developed by Mark Morris Dance Group and the Brooklyn Parkinson Group.

He set off for North America four years later and rapidly established his world-class reputation in beauty, fashion, advertising and editorial with clients like Revlon, Coca-Cola, Smirnoff and magazines like Harpers Bazaar, Rolling Stone, Interview and Italian Vogue.
