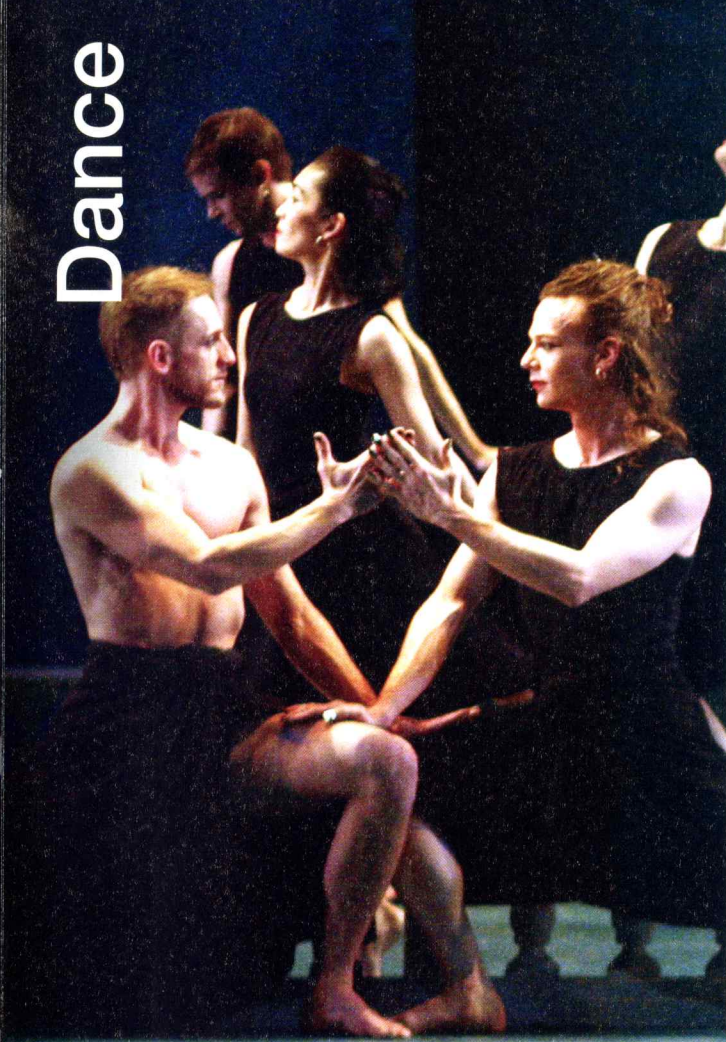

Returning to Cal Performances for the first time in 11 years, Mark Morris's *Dido and Aeneas* "is that remarkable rarity: a work of modern art that looks as though it has come down to us through the ages" (*Washington Post*). More than any other modern choreographer, Morris is also a phenomenal musical artist, and this special presentation of his seminal 1989 creation marries both sides of his vision in a joyous expression of genius. Making his Bay Area conducting debut, Morris leads the forces of the renowned Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra and Chorale in Henry Purcell's 17th-century opera score, while his remarkable company dances the timeless story out of Virgil's *Aeneid*. Mezzo-soprano Stephanie Blythe—"the true successor to Marilyn Horne in the Baroque and bel canto repertory" (*New York Times*)—leads the assembled vocal artists of chorus and soloists.

Trey McIntyre Project

Wondering what the future of modern dance looks like? Trey McIntyre has already created a canon of more than 80 works for such companies as American Ballet Theatre, Stuttgart Ballet, and New York City Ballet. In just six years, his thrilling new troupe has created a sensation with its productions of McIntyre's trademark "fresh and forward-thinking choreography" (*Washington Post*). A hit at the Vail International Dance Festival, *Jacob's Pillow*, and *Wolf Trap*, the company makes its Cal Performances debut with three of McIntyre's most recent works: *In Dreams*, a vibrant tribute to the music of Roy Orbison; *Oh, Inverted World*, a beguiling work set to music by the rock band the Shins; and a new dance set to premiere in Vail and at Lincoln Center *Out of Doors*. "How can ballet work to different kinds of music—pop hits, modernist purity, folk traditions and even recorded speech?" asks the *New York Times* of McIntyre's work. "The results are amazingly fresh, dancy, communicative. So are his dancers."

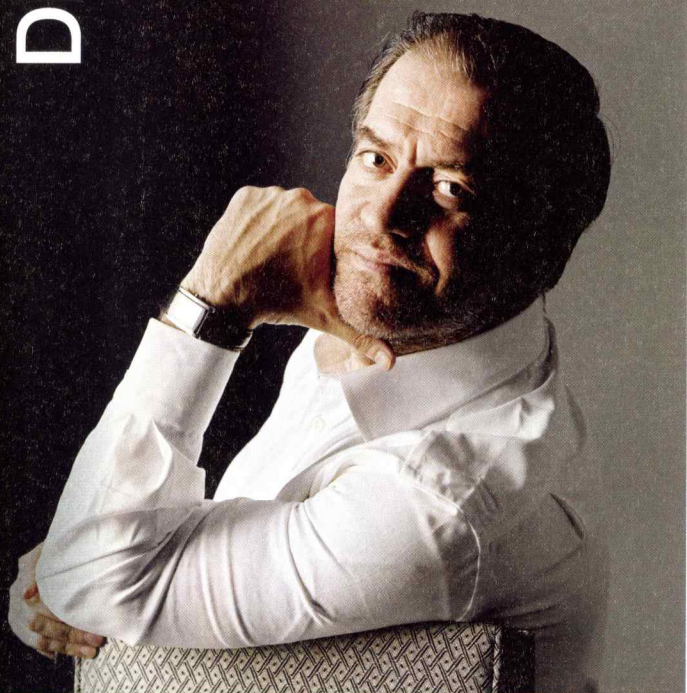
