Tuesday, June 18

On average, people only look into each other's eyes for a maximum of eight seconds—only lovers and people who are about to kill each other lock eyes for longer. Drawing on Marina Abramovic's interest in the prolonged mutual gaze, as explored in *The Life and Death of Marina Abramovic* (see page 10), this discussion brings together facilitator and author Misha Glouberman, neuroscientist Suzanne Dikker from the Sackler Institute, and experimental videographer Amie Siegel.

Wednesday, June 19

Mark Morris is one of the most important creators of dance theatre in the world. The Mark Morris Dance Group will present his masterpiece, *L'Allegro, il Penseroso ed il Moderato* (see page 36) at the Luminato Festival, as well as *L'Allegro Movement Project* (see page 38), in conjunction with Dancing with Parkinson's. Morris will discuss these projects and more live onstage.

Thursday, June 20

Join Claire Messud and three of Canada's best-loved authors, Lisa Moore, Sheila Heti and Miranda Hill, for *A Gala Reading*, Luminato-style, in the Toronto Reference Library's brand new Salon space. Canadian Premiere

Since its creation in 1988, choreographer Mark Morris' legendary *L'Allegro, il Penseroso ed il Moderato* has earned global recognition as his company's crowning achievement. Morris' singular interpretation of the oratorio, combining Handel's music with John Milton's cosmic poetry and William Blake's luminous paintings, becomes a vibrant blend of dance, music, poetry, scenery, costume and lighting design. This dazzling evening-length work boasts two-dozen dancers, a 26-member chorus, four vocal soloists and an orchestra. Exalted as "one of the great dance works of the twentieth century" by *The New Yorker* and "a modern miracle" by the *Huffington Post*, *L'Allegro* is at once joyous, exhilarating and profound. Now celebrating its 25th anniversary, Morris' bold, brilliant masterpiece makes its Canadian debut at the Festival.

Mark Morris Dance Group and Dancing with Parkinson's

In the months leading up to the Luminato Festival, dancers and teachers from Mark Morris Dance Group's ground-breaking Dance for PD® program will collaborate with the Toronto Dancing with Parkinson's group and local elementary school students from Nelson Mandela Park PS and Winchester Junior PS to create *L'Allegro Movement Project*.

Using thematic and structural elements from *L'Allegro, il Penseroso ed il Moderato* as the basis for the movement creation, participants will explore the choreographic, poetic and musical elements of Mark Morris' signature work. Through this collaborative, intergenerational initiative, young students and participants with Parkinson's disease will be empowered to explore and celebrate the expressive possibilities of movement through dance and music.

A select team of young filmmakers will document *L'Allegro Movement Project*, highlighting the creative process. Video excerpts will be available on luminatofestival.com throughout this period and the completed short film will premiere as part of the Regent Park Film Festival in the fall of 2013.

The performance of *L'Allegro Movement Project* will feature the Tafelmusik Baroque Orchestra and Chamber Choir and soloists.
